To All Amateur Theatre Companies in New Mexico:

On behalf of Theatre New Mexico and the Los Alamos Little Theatre, we cordially invite you to participate in New Mexico's AACTFest 2019. The festival and conference will be held **March 21-24, 2019** in Los Alamos, NM.

The American Association of Community Theatres' festivals are part of a multi-year process that culminates in a national festival held in odd-numbered years. AACTFest provides an opportunity for community theatres from AACT's 10 regions to enter productions for adjudication and advancement from state to regional to national level. AACTFest is both a celebration of theatre and a learning experience for those who take part. New Mexico is in Region VI along with the states of Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Texas. New Mexico's state winners will advance to the regional festival in Midland TX, May 2-5 2019. The winner of the regional competition will advance to the national festival in Gettysburg PA, June 18-22 2019.

If you have never entered a festival please consider this as your first. Festivals are not only fun but educational. A variety of workshops are offered. Network with new and old friends, see great productions, listen to adjudications, and of course party! The AACT Handbook will guide you through the process and we are more than willing to answer questions or provide assistance. And remember, even if your theatre doesn't participate with a production, everyone is invited to come and join in the fun as an individual!

All performances and workshops will be held at the Performing Arts Center located at 1670 Nector St. in Los Alamos, NM. For those who attended the AACTFest 2013 there, most of the facility is similar. However a new stage has been installed and the lighting and sound systems have been upgraded.

Enclosed you will find information about: AACTFest basics; the adjudicators and adjudication process; the venue and performance space; local lodging and attractions; and entry requirements, instructions and forms. You can find information and updates about this festival (including this registration packet) on both the TNM (*theatrenm.org/*) and LALT (*lalt.org/*) websites. AACTFest Basics

- Any amateur theatre organized for at least one year prior to the state festival, which has produced at least two shows prior to the state festival entry, is eligible to enter the festival process.
- Maximum time limits are 10 minutes for set-up, 60 minutes for performance, and 10 minutes for strike. A closed 80 minute tech rehearsal is scheduled in the theatre facility.
- Setup and strike occur from and to an adjacent 10'x10' on-deck area. All sets, props, special effects, etc. must fit into the on-deck area.
- Adjudicators provide open feedback to the company following their performance. Final festival results and awards are announced at the concluding awards brunch on Sunday.

AACT Adjudication Guidelines

Among the criteria to be considered are:

- Is the acting believable and technically skillful with effective timing?
- Are the characters well interpreted?
- Does the company display ensemble work?
- Is the material appropriate for the company?
- Is the concept appropriate for the material and realized by the company?
- Has the structure of the production been controlled?
- Are the movements and stage pictures effective?
- Is the production well paced?
- Do the technical elements support the overall production?
- How effective was the total impact?

Focus is placed on positive solutions to problems the companies have with production issues by suggesting alternative possibilities.

AACTFest Venue

Los Alamos Performing Arts Center

1670 Nector St. Los Alamos NM

The Performing Arts Center (PAC) is a Los Alamos County facility operated by the Los Alamos Little Theatre (LALT) since 1973. The building was constructed in 1943 and served as the East Mess Hall during the Manhattan Project. After the war it was converted into a recreation hall. In 1971, when the County planned to tear the building down, LALT recognized its potential as a small theatre and convinced the County to allow it convert the building into a performing arts center. The PAC opened in January 1973 with a production of the melodrama *Ten Nights in a Barroom*. Since 1973 LALT has staged over 230 local productions in the PAC. LALT has also hosted previous New Mexico AACTFests in the facility, most recently in 2013 and 2003. The building is a part of the Manhattan Project National Historical Park walking tour.

Facilities


- Flexible, configurable auditorium seating of up to 150 patrons.
- Full stage with theatrical lighting and sound systems.
- Lobby area with ticket booth and restrooms.
- Control booth located at the rear of the auditorium.
- Green room, makeup room, and two dressing rooms
- Shop area, flats storage, and tool room located behind the stage.
- Kitchen and office.
- Props, costumes, lights, and furniture storage rooms.











The stage is 14" above the floor. The proscenium height is 8'4" above the stage. There is a beam immediately behind the back curtain with a clearance height of 8'2". Legs are fixed. The main and back curtains will be open during set up and strike. During performances the back curtain will be closed and the main curtain can be positioned as desired.

Two 10'x10' setup boxes will be located on the floor immediately behind the stage. The setup boxes have a height limit of 10'. There is an outside double door to the backstage area for loading and unloading sets. The door opening is 54" wide by 77" high. There is a door up stage left leading to the green, makeup, and dressing rooms.

Entry doors into the auditorium are at the rear. There are also doors on both sides, immediately in front of the stage. The door stage left leads to a hallway with access to the up stage left door. The double door stage right leads to the outside. It has an opening of 70" wide by 79" high.

The ceiling over the stage and audience is low and there are no provisions for flying objects.

Technical Systems

Lighting

- ETC Express 24/48 programmable lighting control console.
- Basic area lighting provided, cool and warm. Lighting plot will be provided.
- Overhead RGBW strip light.
- Two moving head lights (Chauvet Intimidator Spot 355 IRC)
- Two RGBW LED PARs (Altman SSSP-RGBW)
- Sufficient circuits and instruments to accommodate specials within AACTFest guidelines.

Sound

- Stereo sound system. Speakers located down stage on left and right sides.
- Mackie 1402VLZ analog mixer. Can accommodate laptops or other sound equipment.
- Windows 10 PC sound computer with Show Cue Systems license.
- CD player available upon request.
- Monitor speakers in green and dressing rooms.

WiFi internet connections available.

AACTFest 2019 Entry Process

<u>Get Started</u>

- 1. Download and read <u>all</u> of the 2019 AACTFest Handbook. (*aact.org/aactfest/handbook.html*)
- 2. Select a play/production for the competition with a run time of 60 minutes or less.
 - May be a one-act, full-length cut with permission or one act of a full length play that stands alone. May be published or original.
 - Pyrotechnics and firearms will not be allowed.
 - Further requirements are outlined in the 2019 AACTFest Handbook, page 4.
- 3. Commit to participation by December 31, 2018 (email preferable, but verbally will do!)
- 4. Submit forms and fees as described below.

<u>Festival Fees</u>

Participating Theatres:

- Participating theatres in the NM State Festival must be Organizational Members of Theatre New Mexico (TNM). The annual fee is \$80.
- A festival fee equal to the amount of the lowest AACT Organizational Membership (currently \$80) made payable to AACT . <u>This fee is waived for AACT Organizational</u> <u>Members</u>. Organizational membership in AACT is required, though, at the regional and national levels, so why not join now and reap the benefits. Membership information can be found on the AACT website. (<u>aact.org/membership-fees</u>)

Participating Individuals

- All individuals participating in a production—both on stage and off—must be registered for the Festival. Registration includes admission to all performances, adjudications, workshops, and social events.
- Festival registrants must be TNM Individual Members. The annual fee is \$25 for adults and \$15 for students. This can be paid on the registration form
- Festival registrants must also pay the festival registration fee of \$65 for adults and \$40 for students.

- TNM Organizational Membership form and 2019 membership payment. This form is included in this package. Fill out and mail in with payment to "TNM."
- AACT participation fee if Theatre is <u>not</u> an AACT organizational member. Mail in check payable to "AACT."
- Four copies of the script, marked as intended to be performed (No photocopies of scripts are permitted without written permission for the author/agent.)

February 2, 2019 (postmarked or emailed) - Individual entry forms

- AACTFest 2019 Affidavits of Actor Eligibility Form T3, for each individual performer. This AACT form must be downloaded from the AACT website (*aact.org/festival-handbook*) under "Entering Company Forms", filled out and signed.
- AACTFest Technical Information Form T4. This is an AACT online form that must be completed online and submitted from the AACT website (*aact.org/aactfestival-technical-information-t4*). On the form fill in *aactfest2019@lalt.org* for the Festival Chair's email address. Under Region Number select 6
- Individual registration forms and fees for each participant. This form is included in this package. Payments to "TNM."
